MEETING CONVENED:

Mayor Tuggle called the regular meeting of the Eden City Council to order and welcomed those in attendance. He explained that the Council meets the third Tuesday of each month at 7:30 p.m. and works from a prepared agenda; however, time would be set aside for business not on the printed agenda.

INVOCATION:

Mr. Torrey Easler, Pastor, Pleasant View Baptist Church, gave the invocation followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

RECOGNITIONS & PROCLAMATIONS:

a. Recognition of Reggie Denney Auto Repair Anniversary

Mayor Tuggle asked Mr. Mike Dougherty, Director of Business & Economic Development, to come forward for the presentation.

Mr. Dougherty recognized Mr. and Mrs. Reggie Denney and presented them with a plaque in commemoration of their 35th anniversary in business.

b. Presentation of Letters of Commendation for Outstanding Job Performance.

c. Proclamation: World Changers Week in Rockingham County

NEW BUSINESS:

a. Approval and Adoption of Amendment to Chapter 10 Article XII of the City of Eden North Carolina Code of Ordinances

The City of Eden Safety and Loss Control Committee is in the process of updating the OSHA & Safety and Loss Control Manual. Section C of the manual is Chapter 10 Article XII of City of Eden North Carolina Code of Ordinances. We have updated this section to reflect changes in wording, department divisions, member numbers, and subcommittees (see separate attachment, "revised section C ARTICLE XII-marked up"). Changes are in red.

The City of Eden Safety and Loss Control Committee's recommendation is that the changes to this article be made.

Mayor Tuggle asked Fire Chief Tommy Underwood to come forward.

Chief Underwood explained that over the last two years the Safety Committee has met once a month to update the Safety and Loss Control Manual. They have had to make a few changes due to new members or departments. He wanted to thank Sgt. Sam Shelton and Melinda Ward for their assistance.

They also added a subcommittee to make sure that the manual was updated more often.

Council Member Burnette asked if they were doing this on a monthly review and was he just taking a particular part of the manual itself to which Chief Underwood replied yes, they were complete with it now. Council Member Burnette asked how often they would go through the manual. He knew it was so much per month but how long would it take to go through the whole manual.

Chief Underwood explained that it had taken them two years but the new subcommittee should stay on top of it and if any changes need to be made hopefully they would make them at that time.

Council Member Burnette asked if it was all OSHA compliant to which Chief Underwood replied that it was.

A motion was made by Council Member Epps seconded by Council Member Ellis to approve and adopt the amendment to Chapter 10 Article XII of the City of Eden code. All Council Members voted in favor of this motion. This motion carried.

The attached budget amendment sets up a special revenue fund and allocates grant proceeds for the Loparex Building Reuse Grant from the NC Department of Commerce. Since this grant will span over two fiscal years, it is necessary to set up a special revenue fund to account for the activity. The budget amendment includes a \$6,000 city contribution of which \$4,000 came from Rockingham County and Citizens Economic Development and \$2,000 from the city. The remaining \$120,000 comes from the NC Department of Commerce and will be paid to Loparex.

f. Approval and Adoption of Budget Amendment #13.

The attached budget amendment allocates General Fund and Water & Sewer Fund fund balances to the Self-Insurance fund. Our estimated expenditures (claims) for the Self-Insurance fund for the year-ending June 30, 2014, will possibly be over budget by \$350,000. The estimates are based on the past 5 years of claims using the highest year. It is very hard to estimate claims because there is no way of knowing what will be incurred before year end. As you may recall, we did this budget amendment last fiscal year. After all the claims have come in and been posted to fiscal year 13-14, any fund balance that was not needed will be moved back to the appropriate fund.

j. Request for Consideration of Approving the Conveyance of Surplus and Unused Property to the Eden Family YMCA.

The memorandum explained that Shaw Construction was the prime contractor for Duke Energy during the construction of the new power plant located on Edgewood Road. During the summer of 2013, Shaw Construction had over 300 used railroad ties that they wished to dispose of as the project was ending and offered them to the city at no cost. The city accepted these railroad ties and transported them to the public works yard on Klyce Street where they were stockpiled.

The Eden Family YMCA has approached the city and requested that the city give them 40 surplus railroad ties that are currently stored in our public works yard on Klyce Street. The YMCA has recently expanded their parking lot area and wishes to use the railroad ties as stops for parking spaces.

Eden City Attorney, Erin Gilley, has prepared a Resolution for Council to consider the conveyance of 40 of these railroad ties to the YMCA for a public purpose in the new parking area. The YMCA will provide for the transport of the ties to the YMCA property.

RESOLUTION TO CONVEY PERSONAL PROPERTY

WHEREAS, the City of Eden owns 40 railroad ties, hereinafter referred to as, "the property"; and

WHEREAS, the aforementioned property was given to the City of Eden due to a dismantling of a corporate facility and has remained on City property and unused for more than a year; and is hereby declared surplus and unused; and

WHEREAS, the City of Eden desires to convey this aforementioned surplus and unused property to the Eden Family YMCA, a nonprofit organization located in Eden, North Carolina pursuant to NCGS 160A-279 in consideration for the Eden Family YMCA using this property for a public purpose; and

WHEREAS, the City of Eden has placed the condition upon the conveyance of the property that this property be sued for a public purpose; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council for the City of Eden pursuant to NCGS 160A-279 that the 40 railroad ties be conveyed to the Eden Family YMCA, upon the condition that the railroad ties be used for a public purpose.
